- A 2.0 GPA out of a possible 4.0 from a Metro Louisville area high school from Jefferson, Oldham, Shelby and Bullitt Counties in Kentucky and Floyd, Clark and Harrison counties in Indiana or a documented home-schooled student in your school district from one of these seven counties
- Must be pursuing a non-performing, visual art-related major in college
- Applicants must submit jpgs of the five best pieces representing their portfolio for their application to be considered.

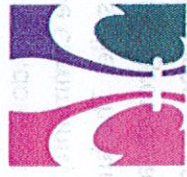

SELECTION PROCESS

The Louisville Artisans Guild is Kentucky's oldest guild dedicated to the pursuit of excellence in arts and craft. It was founded in 1956 as the Louisville Craftsmen Guild. In 2003, the name was changed to better reflect our purpose and membership.

We are pleased to offer this scholarship to help high school seniors pursuing a non-performing visual art-related major with their first year in college.

The Scholarship is an endowment fund administered by the Community Foundation of Louisville. The fund is invested for long-term growth, and only a portion of the fund is used for scholarships each year.

The Scholarship was initiated in 1995 as a \$300 award and has grown to a one-time award of \$2,000. The scholarship recipient is also awarded a Louisville Artisans Guild membership and a booth at our annual Holiday Showcase in November of their scholarship year.

The name of the applicant will not be disclosed to the jury committee members, but will be identified by an assigned number only. Applicants are required to submit the five best pieces representing their portfolio. Before uploading artwork please cover names on artwork whenever possible. No jury member may be related to any applicant nor may any member be acquainted with any applicant in more than a casual manner.

Upon reviewing all applications for completeness, the jury committee of LAG juried artists will evaluate each application on a 1 (low) to 10 (High) scale in the following areas:

1. Appearance-visual impact
2. Design-appropriate use of design elements
3. Originality/Creativity
4. Workmanship-good technique
5. Items appropriately finished-overall neatness

The preliminary jurying will be completed on line. The scores will be totaled and averaged by the Community Foundation of Louisville. The top 20% (or 3 if less than 8) applicants will be declared semi-finalists. Semi-finalists will then be contacted to present their body of work in person on March 18, 2023.

The jury committee will score each applicant's five pieces in person on March 18, 2023. The committee will send their recommendations to the Community Foundation of Louisville. All semi-finalists will be notified by the second week of April.

The first runner-up shall also be noted and the name retained in the event the winner is unable to accept the scholarship or attend school.
