NCAA Eligibility Portal

- If you want to play NCAA sports at a Division I or II school, you need to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.
- If you plan to compete at a Division III school or currently are not sure in which division you want to compete, create a free Profile Page account.

Academic Requirements

- To play sports at a Division I or II school, you must complete a total of 16 NCAA-approved core courses, earn a corresponding test score* that matches your core-course GPA and submit proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

Recruiting Process

- NCAA: coaches cannot contact you until August 1st before your junior year.
- **NAIA: After 11th grade** a coach can have unlimited contact with an athlete. Prior to 11th grade, a coach can send you printed materials and make contact by phone. Athletes are allowed one official visit to given school beginning senior year.
